### Swimming 2019

Swimming as part of the NC provision within school - Pupils are tracked and monitored by the PE coordinator. All pupils are assessed against the national curriculum attainment targets. Children in Year 3 have swimming sessions in the first half of every half term. Children in Year 2, 4 and 5 have half a term swimming lessons each academic year. Children in Year 6 who have not met the standard for swimming in the summer term have half a term's worth of swimming booster sessions.
