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<p>Maths Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Access White Rose Maths home learning materials. - Play on Times Tables Rockstars, Try to master you 2, 5 and 10 times tables. - Choose a number between 1 and 50. Can you represent this number in as many ways as possible? E.g. using dienes blocks, straws, beads, counters, words, tens frame, part/whole. - Can you practise counting in 2s to 24, 5s to 60 and 10s to 120? - Play on Hit the Button. Practise your number bonds to 10 and addition within 10. - Make a timetable of your day. Can you write all the things you have been doing and what time you did them? E.g. 7 o'clock get up, half past 7 have breakfast, 9 o'clock read a book. 	<p>Reading Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read a book every day. This could be on Oxford Reading Buddy or one from home. - Listen to a story read by someone else. You could use this online story telling website, storyline. - Books to read/listen to online <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - The Enormous Crocodile – Roald Dahl - The Smeds and the Smoos- Julia Donaldson - Starting School- Janet and Allan Ahlberg - The Giraffe, the Pelly and Me- Roald Dahl - Comprehension <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Think of 10 questions about a book you have read. Can you ask them to somebody else who has read the book? - Write a book review about a book you have read. Can you write how you feel about the book? What are your favourite parts and characters?

Remember to use adjectives to improve your writing. - Write a guide about how you should care for a pet. You can choose any animal you like. - Design your own animal, give it a name and write a description about it. What does it look like? Where does it live? What interesting things can it do? <p>SPAG</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write 5 sentences about animals. Don't forget your capital letters and full stops. Can you include a conjunction? (and, but because) - Think of 10 nouns and 10 proper nouns. Write them down, which ones need a capital letter?

<p>Science- Animals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Write a description about each of the different animal classifications: mammals, reptiles, birds, amphibians, fish and invertebrates. Can you think of 3 animals which belong in each classification? - Can you describe the differences between carnivores and herbivores? Choose a carnivore and an herbivore and write a list of the foods they eat. - Choose a predator. Draw a picture of your animal and label all its important features with some information about each one. <p>Religious Education- Beginnings</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Can you retell the creation story? Draw a picture to show what God did on each day. - Research about the sacrament of Baptism. Can you write a prayer that could be read during a baptism service? - Listen to the song 'This little light of mine'. Can you draw a picture to show how the song makes you feel? <p>History-</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Make a list of 5 local man-made landmarks/buildings (e.g. Angel of the North, Tyne Bridge). Can you find out when they were built? Put them in order on your own timeline. Can you find out 3 facts about each of your landmarks?
