<p>Maths Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Access White Rose Maths home learning materials. - Play on Times Tables Rockstars, Try to master you 3, 4, 5 and 6 - times tables. - Choose a number between 1 and 100. Can you represent this number in as many ways as possible? E.g. using dienes blocks, straws, beads, counters, words, tens frame, part/whole. - Can you practise counting in 2s to 50, 5s and 10s to 100 and 10s to 1000? - Learn quick random recall of the 3, 4 and 5 times tables and their related division facts. - Practise the place value of each digit in two-digit and three-digit numbers. - Play on Hit the Button. Practise your number bonds to 10 and 20 and addition within 10 and 20. - 	<p>Reading Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read a book every day. This could be on Oxford Reading Buddy or one from home. - Listen to a story read by someone else. Can you ask them to somebody else who has read the book? - Write a book review about a book you have read. Can you write how you feel about the book? What are your favourite parts and characters?
