Weekly Reflection - David Frank

Ez 34: 11-12, 15-17 Ps 127 1 Cor 15: 20-26, 28 Mt 25: 31-46

For I was hungry, and you gave me food
I was thirsty, and you gave me drink
I was a stranger, and you made me welcome
I was naked, and you clothed me
I was sick, and you visited me
I was in prison, and you came to see me
In so far you did this to one of the least of these
brothers of mine you did it to me.

There is something very fundamental about today's message from the Gospel. Something well worth our consideration. Jesus is talking to his disciples about the last judgement. He lists some criteria which will be used to separate the sheep from the goats. There is no mention of how many times they have been to Mass or how well their prayer life has progressed. No, the main criteria listed in Matthews Gospel is how well they have loved. Faithfulness brings its own reward. But unless we make the love of others our main priority faith has no meaning. We cannot save ourselves: We can only do what we can for each other and hope that our efforts are sufficient to save us. Belonging to a church does not ensure salvation. We must follow Christ every day and act as He did to the hungry, the thirsty, the homeless, the lost and the sick. It is only by giving of ourselves that we find eternal life.
