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<p>Maths Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Access White Rose Maths home learning materials. - Play on Times Tables Rockstars, Try to master you 6, 7, 8 and 9 - times tables. - Add/subtract two 2 digit numbers E.g. using dienes blocks, straws, beads, counters, words, tens frame, part/whole. - Can you practise counting in 2s to 50, 5s and 10s to 100 and 10s to 1000? - Learn quick random recall of the 5, 6 and 7 times tables and their related division facts. - Practise the place value of each digit in two-digit and three-digit numbers. - Play on Hit the Button. Practise your number bonds to 10 and 20 and addition within 10 and 20. - 	<p>Reading Tasks</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Read a book every day. This could be on Oxford Reading Buddy or one from home. - Listen to a story read by someone else. You could use this online story telling website, storyline. - Books to read/listen to online <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Any book from The Horrid Henry Series – Francesca Simon - Fair's Fair – Leon Garfield - The Best Christmas Present in the World - Michael Morpurgo. - Books to read/listen to online: Durham Online Library use this site via the Borrowbox App. It allows you to borrow eBooks and eAudiobooks <p>Login for FREE with a valid library card (you can apply here to join the library as a guest)</p> <p>Comprehension</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> - Think of 10 questions about a book you have read. Can you ask them to somebody else who has read the book? - Write a book review about a book you have read. Can you write how you feel about the book? What are your favourite parts and characters?
<p>Phonics/Spelling Tasks</p> <p>Learn the second 20 spellings from the Year 3 and 4 Statutory Spelling list. Look at satellite images of the UK – What do you notice?

What do you already know about the United Kingdom – Produce a mind map.

Label a diagram about the source of a river.

Using a map of the UK -record the major rivers and cities.
